



Baby Booties



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These sweet little booties are very quick and easy to make for those who are beginners and experienced knitters. You should be able to make three pairs of booties from 100g of yarn.

Materials needed

1 x 100g ball Rico Classic Baby DK and King Cole Merino Blend DK: Jeans, Fuchsia, Glacier, Oatmeal and Carnation.

Needles, size 4.00mm [UK 8, US 6]

Large eyed sewing needle

Tension: 20 stitches x 40 rows measure 10cm using 4.00mm needles and garter stitch.

Measurements: To fit age birth to 3 months.



Instructions

You will begin at the base of the bootie.
Using 4.00mm needles cast on 40 sts.
Work 14 rows in garter stitch (knit every row)

Shaping the toe:

You will now begin to shape the toe by decreasing stitches on following rows.

1st row: K17, k2tog, k2, skpo, k17. [38 sts]

2nd row: Knit

3rd row: K16, k2tog, k2, skpo, k16. [36 sts]

4th row: K15, k2tog, k2, skpo, k15. [34 sts]

5th row: K14, k2tog, k2, skpo, k14. [32 sts]

6th row: K13, k2tog, k2, skpo, k13. [30 sts]

7th row: K12, k2tog, k2, skpo, k12. [28 sts]

Work straight without further decrease for 20 rows.
Cast off fairly loosely.

Finishing:

Fold the piece in half and sew the seam on the base of the foot and back leg. Make another bootie to match.

Abbreviations

K = Knit P = Purl St(s) = Stitch(es)

K2tog = Knit 2sts together.

Skpo = Slip next stitch, knit next stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch.
